23rd March 2025 - Third Sunday of Lent

Dear Parishioners and fellow Pilgrims of Hope,

We are now in the 3rd week of Lent. You would have observed that some of our Sunday Readings are set in a wilderness or on a mountain. The choice and settings of these readings are more than coincidental. My observation is that during this Lent, so far, we have been led through three significant mountains: The Mountain of Temptation, the Mountain of



Transfiguration and the Mountain of Encounter. At the mountain of temptation, we learn from Jesus that the children of God are not immune from temptations but have the capacity to overcome different kinds of temptation in their life. At the mountain of transfiguration, we learn that Jesus is the fulfilment of the law and prophets, so we are urged to listen to him. Horeb is called the mountain of God and I call it the mountain of encounter. As I reflect on the 1st reading (Ex. 3:1-8, 13-15) on the 3rd Sunday of Lent year C, I see Moses as a symbol of all those who are being led by God to a place of encounter. Now, although some of us have been to all three mountains, the pace of the Lenten journey may different for different people. It is likely that some people may even start their Lenten journey in a reverse order depending on their awareness of where God is leading them.

After the 2nd session of our 2025 Lenten Retreat last Wednesday (and thanks to Sr Margaret Endicott), I resumed an intentional use of an ancient practice of prayer developed by St Ignatius of Loyola. The practice is called 'Examen' and I would recommend it to you for the rest of Lent. There are five steps of the Examen: Gratitude, Awareness, Understanding, Conversion and Reconciliation. These five steps of the Ignatian Examen can be adapted to different circumstances of life. Hence, everyone could practise it.

I would like to use the Exodus story of the burning bush to illustrate how the practice of the Examen can lead us to encounter God. Although God has always been with Moses, Moses needed the burning bush to centre his attention in order to hear God. All of his senses were attentive because he could see, talk, hear, and even took off his shoes to feel the holiness of God's presence. Where do we feel the presence of God in our everyday life? On the other hand, where do we hear the voice of God every day? As a result of the burning bush, Moses encountered God in the wilderness while he was completing his everyday tasks. Moses understood the mission that God had for him beyond looking after the flock of Jethro and he accepted as a form of conversion, to go back to Egypt in order to save God's people. As with Moses, God is always with us in the big and small events of life but we need to be aware, understand, amend our ways, and appreciate the presence of God.

Thank you to all parishioners who have signed up for Parish Ministry. The parish ministry is surely a place for the opportunity of divine encounter for those who serve and those we serve. Once again, I say to you, WE NEED YOU TO JOIN OUR PARISH MINISTRY TEAM. Scan our ministry QR code, click the volunteer button on the parish eNews or fill the Ministry Sunday Form hard copy.


